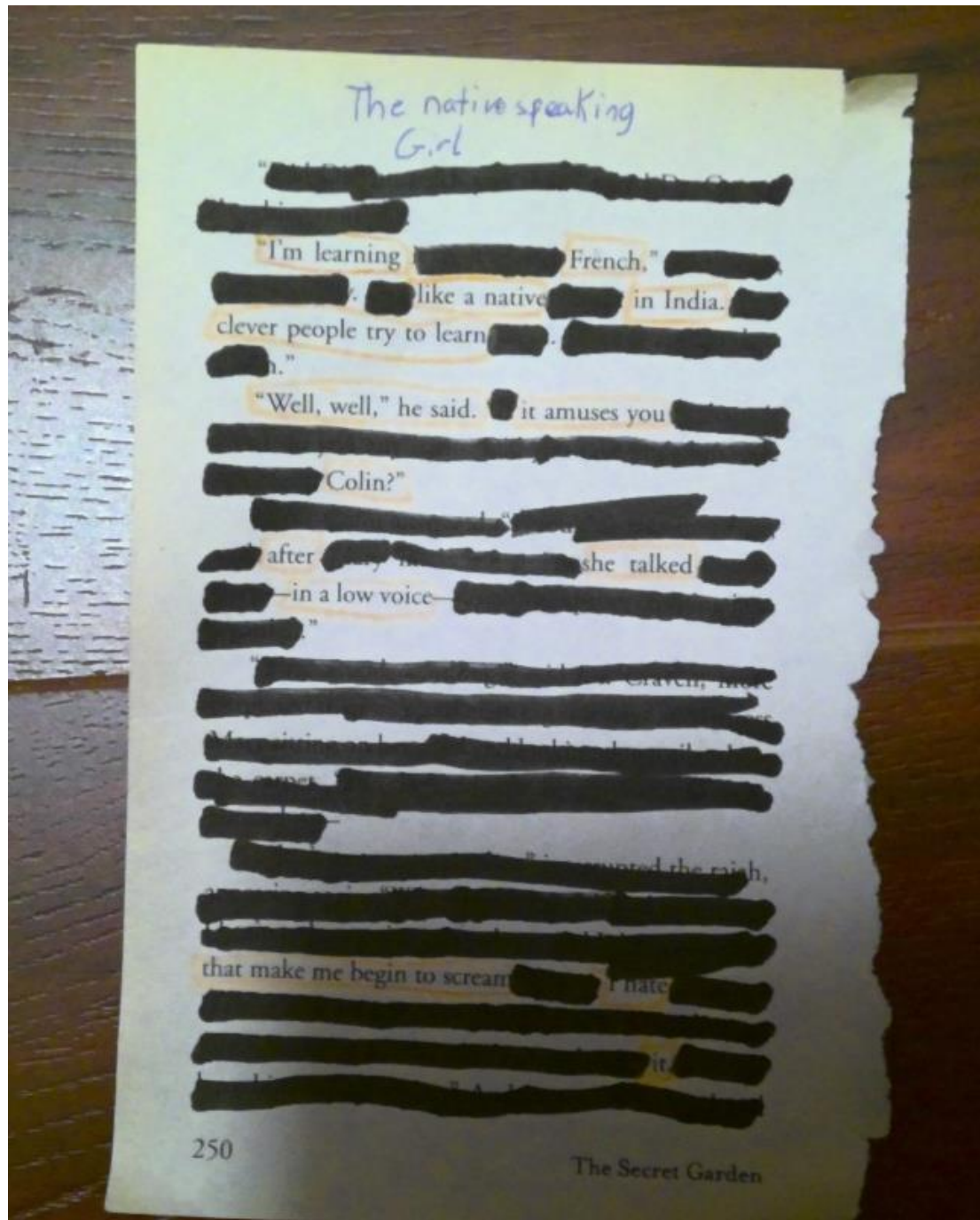
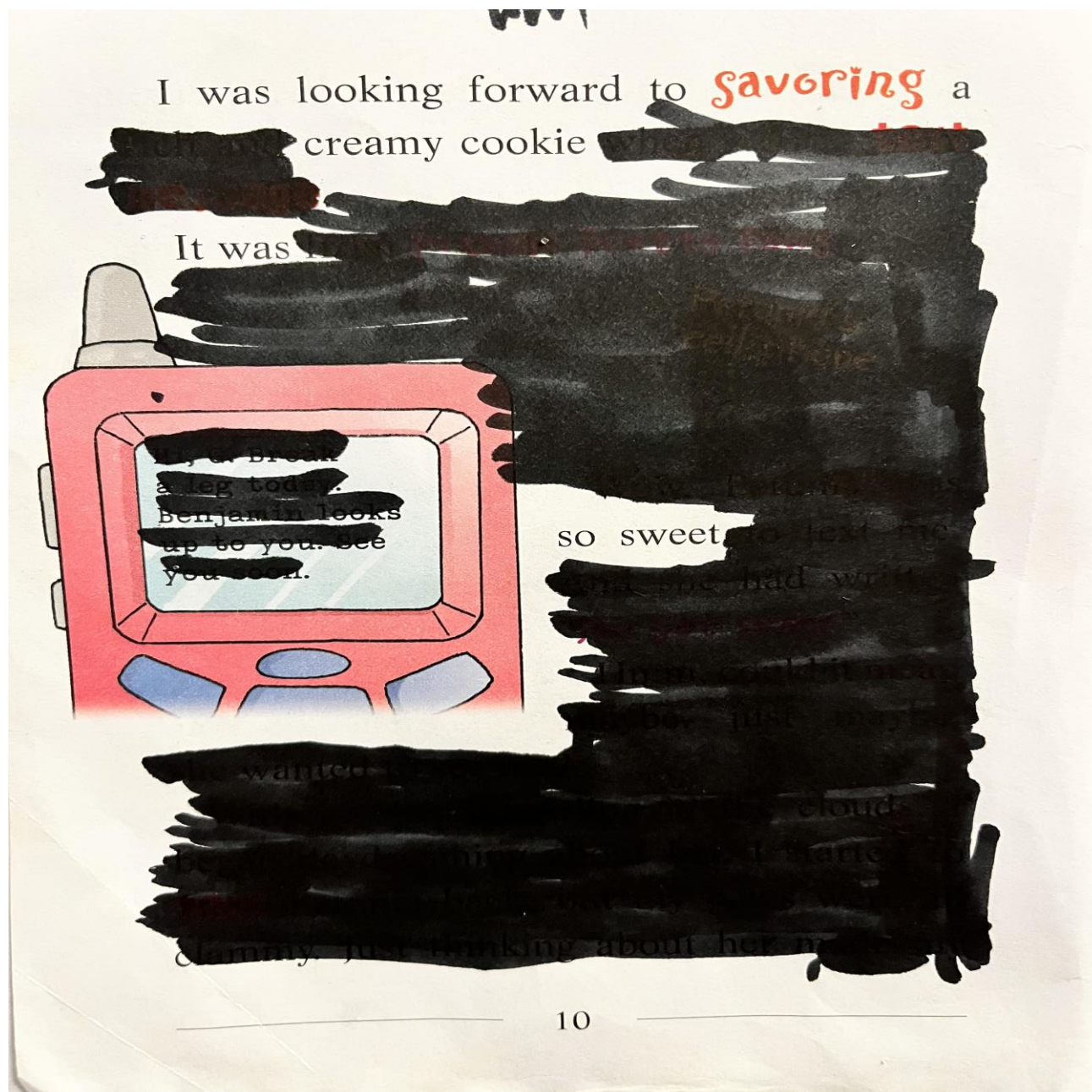

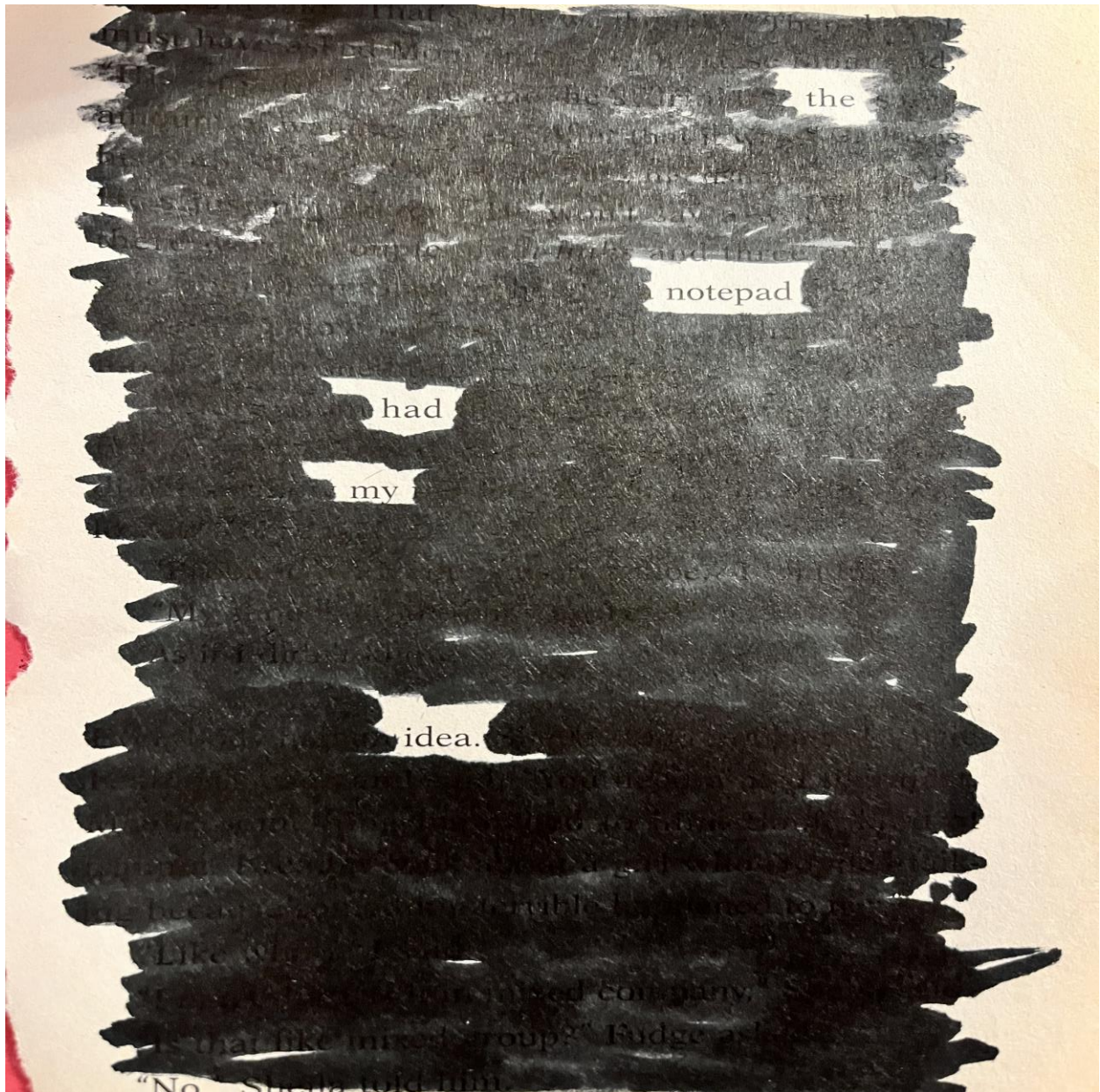


#1: 'The Native Girl Speaking' by Kyra

#3: 'The Yummy Cookie', by Emma

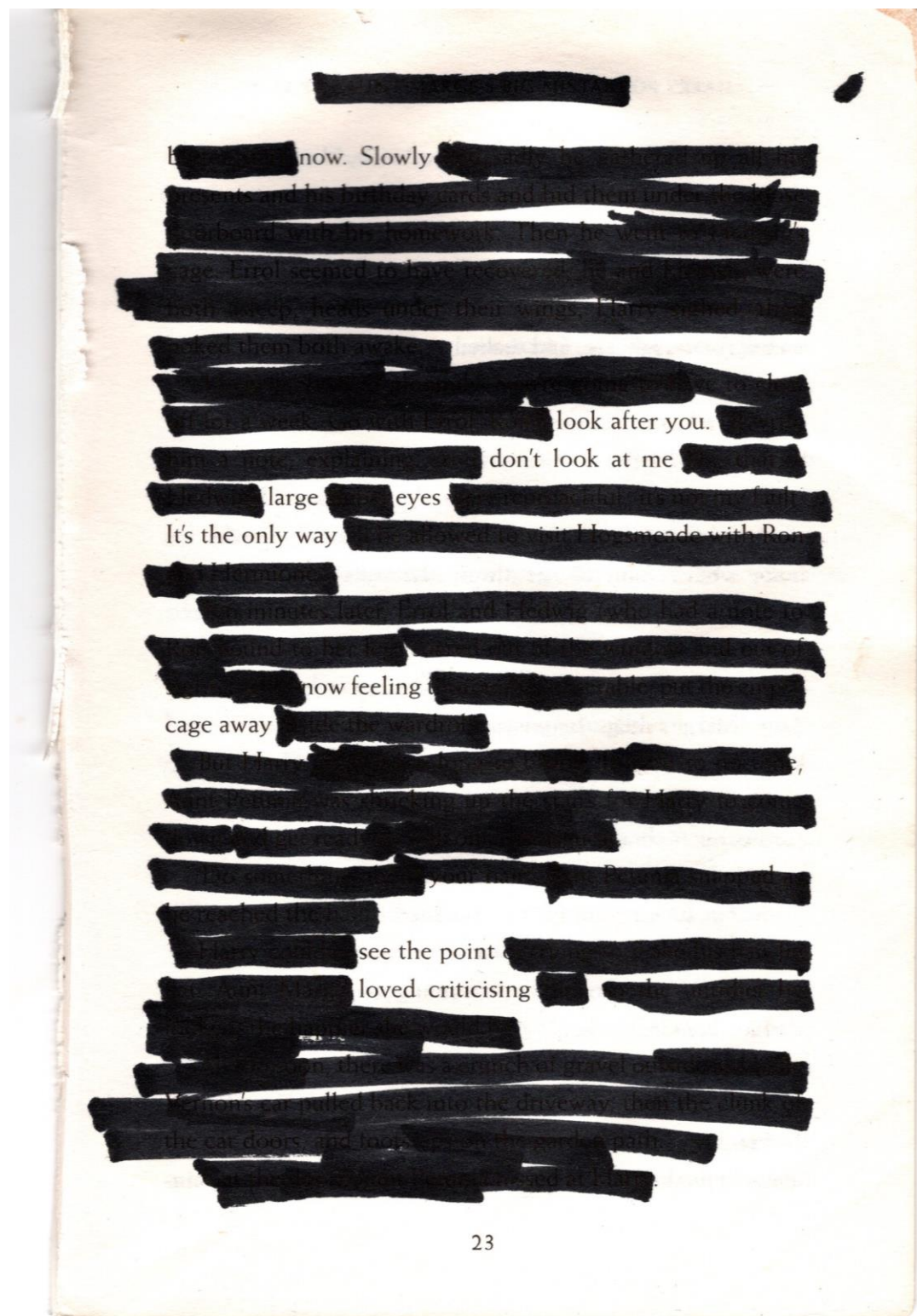


#4: 'Notepad', by Audrey

I just remembered something," he said.

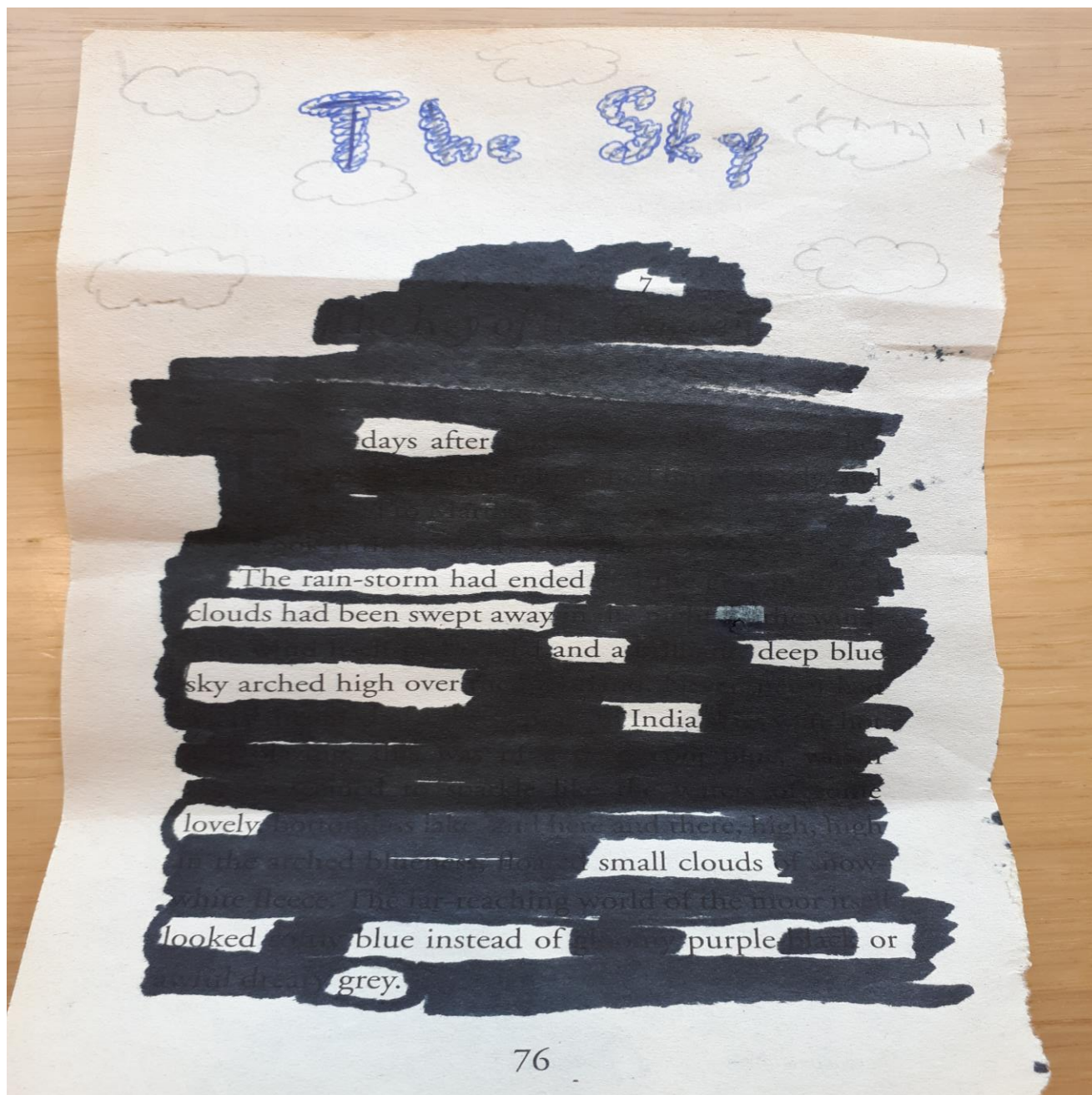
